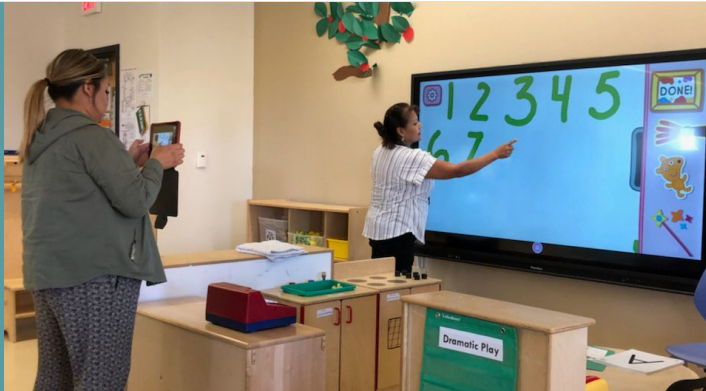

Visual Schedules in the Preschool Classroom

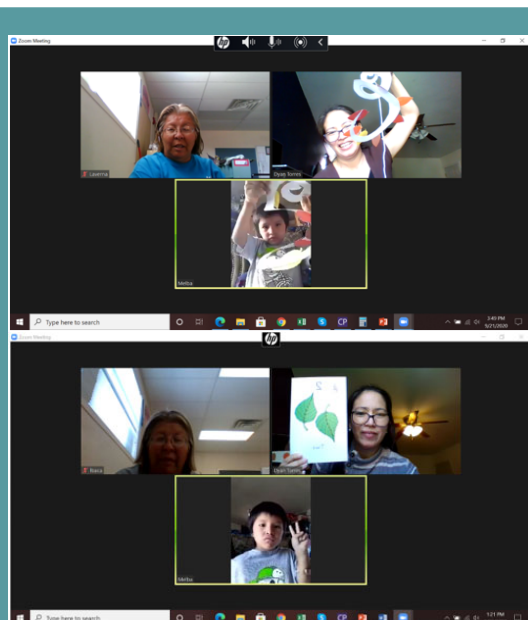
- Visual schedules are an important part of the preschool classroom. Learn what they are, how they can be used, and view examples.

Engaging Library Spaces

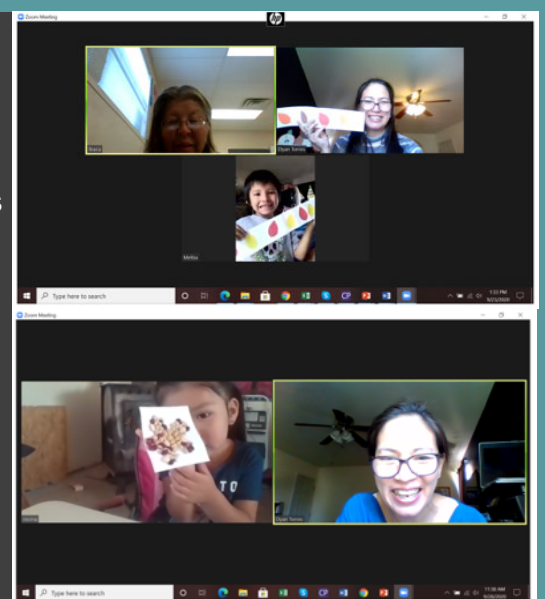
- This snapshot will help increase engagement in the library area with a few quick tips and teach families how to create an engaging library space at home.
